Abington Township Fire Department Wins Statewide Volunteer Recruitment & Retention Award

The Firemen’s Association of the State of Pennsylvania awarded its 2019 Provident Recruitment & Retention Award to the Abington Township Fire Department (A.T.F.D.).

“Congratulations!” wrote Sandy Waybrant of the Awards Committee in an August 1 letter announcing this achievement. “The program you were responsible for resulted in an increase in membership sustained over two years.”

It is extremely rare for a township the size of Abington to have a 100% volunteer fire department. The A.T.F.D. has added 95 new members since Jan. 1, 2013 – including seven new members in 2019! - and currently has 220 active members.

At a time when a decrease in volunteer firefighters has reached critical levels in Pennsylvania, this stability says a lot about the dedication and commitment of each one of the A.T.F.D.’s volunteers, experienced and new. This award is for them.

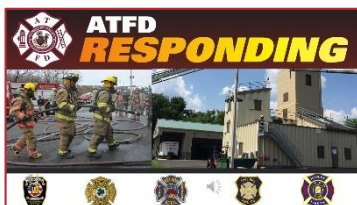

Introducing Ladder 100!

Abington Fire Company recently took delivery of this new 2019 Pierce Arrow XT. Now known as Ladder 100, the truck has a 107-foot ladder, can store 500 gallons of water in an on-board tank, and can pump 1,500 gallons per minute.



Coming Soon: Video Snapshots of the A.T.F.D.

The Abington Township Fire Department is producing a series of short videos designed to give township residents and officials a better understanding of what we do and how we do it.



The first of these video snapshots features our state-of-the-art training facility. Having our own training area – which is unusual for a volunteer fire department – means our volunteers can learn to fight fires and keep their skills current close to home. That’s a huge time savings!



Established in 1958 and regularly updated, our facility includes a live burn tower where firefighters practice by fighting actual fires and a rescue prop that simulates rescues from confined spaces and collapsed structures, along with classroom space.

The training facility video will be shown during a township meeting. Two other A.T.F.D. videos, one on the ways we collect and use data and another featuring the story of one of our volunteer firefighters, will follow.

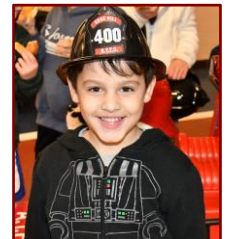
A.T.F.D. With Our Community
