- 5. **Guest:** Jordan Brunette (JB), District Director from the Office of Senator Art Haywood, spoke to EAC on a variety of constituent services offered, provided updates on legislation/status of House/Senate Bills, and listened to our EAC priorities and concerns. Key points included:
  - Senator Haywood's Top 12 2019 Accomplishments
  - The People's Budget: A Comprehensive Plan for PA
  - Watershed restoration and protection programs
  - <u>DEP Grants, Loans, and Rebates</u> program summary with <u>Electronic Single Application (ESA)</u> system
  - EAC requesting support on educating the public on various environmental issues (proper recycling, SLF, energy conservation) as long as it is a district-wide benefit. JB requested an email summary of needs/concerns.

#### 6. Active Business

- A. **Sustainable Abington/USGBC LEED for Cities Program:** On 2/11, the USGBC informed Abington Township that they were awarded a LEED for Cities grant in support of pursuing certification under the LEED for Cities and Communities rating system. Commissioner Thompson recommended that EAC assess other rating systems such as WELL. The BOC will vote on whether to move forward with the recertification during the 2/13 BOC meeting.
- B. Comprehensive Plan Updates: AM mentioned an environmental management chapter in the CP which aims to cover tree management, LEED strategy, and other sustainable practices. NG has also been working closely with Cheltenham Township on an Energy Transition Plan template to support the CP.
- C. **Development Plan Reviews:** EAC will continue to monitor the Redstone at Baederwood Residential Development plan as there are still many unaddressed concerns regarding fire/emergency and stormwater management.
- D. Energy Initiatives:
  - CDP 2019 Cities Disclosure Questionnaire: No major discussion.
  - Rf100 Updates No major discussion.
- E. Rain Barrel program: KMR proposed RB workshop dates and respective volunteers for April, May, and June events.
- F. **Abington-Jenkintown Connection Project:** AM mentioned McMahon Associates survey group will be meeting with AT tomorrow (2/13) to discuss "grey-to-green infrastructure" and potential funding for the multi-use corridor on Washington Lane, Jenkintown Road, Greenwood Avenue, and Meetinghouse Road.
- G. **Bylaws review and discussion** Terry Castorina, Executive Assistant to the Township Manager, will be reaching out to the EAC about updates to the bylaws.

### 7. New Business:

- A. Climate Collaborative of Greater Philadelphia (CCGP) CE discussed the benefits and responsibilities for the Township as a potential participating partner. AM requested that EAC provide a more quantitative summary of benefits, labor, and costs associated with being a CCGP partner.
