## A Change in A.T.F.D. Administration

### David Schramm Has Retired After 18 Jam-Packed Years



David Schramm has retired after 18 years.

After nearly two decades as Abington Township Fire Department Fire Services Administrator, David Schramm has retired. His former duties are now those of Thomas McAneney, who will also work with the township's Police Department as Director of Fire and Emergency Management Services.

Dave, a former Weldon Fire Company chief who remains an active volunteer, began his Abington Township Fire Department (A.T.F.D.) administrative career in 2004 – the same year he retired as an Abington Junior High School assistant principal. His first focus was leading the A.T.F.D. toward accreditation through the Commission on Fire Accreditation International (CFAI). It was a huge undertaking, requiring the establishment of new programs and the collection of data to confirm A.T.F.D.'s excellence in fire suppression, fire training, strategic planning, finances, education, physical and human resources, and firefighter safety. A.T.F.D. achieved accreditation in 2014, was re-accredited in 2019, and is Pennsylvania's only all-volunteer department to be CFAI certified.

Dave drew upon his experience as a fire chief and firefighter when instituting a free annual firefighter

physical program, investing in the Firefighter Training Facility, establishing a successful grant writing initiative, and creating a robust volunteer recruitment and retention program. During a period when most volunteer fire companies lost membership, the A.T.F.D. has maintained a roster of at least 220 active volunteers.

He also drew upon his experience as an educator to strengthen the relationship between the A.T.F.D. and the school district and its students. He promoted the junior firefighter program, supported the high school's junior firefighter club, and ensured the A.T.F.D. took an active role in the Mock Crash, 24-hour Relay, and Service Learning Day.

"He's really been the driving force in making us one fire department with common guidelines and common operations, not just five fire companies that all happen to be in Abington Township. I think that's a huge accomplishment," said Tom, his successor. "I will be continuing the work he has done to keep the ball moving forward so we remain a strong volunteer department into the future."

### Thomas McAneney Brings Fire & Law Enforcement Experience to a New Position

Tom is an Edge Hill Fire Company volunteer and deputy chief. Before assuming his new role early this year, he served as Emergency Management Coordinator for the Township and Penn State Abington. He was previously the director of a large ambulance company and a Montgomery County Assistant District attorney.

"It is rare to find one person with experience in law enforcement, emergency management and fire suppression. Tom has all of that and more," said Dave. "Our township is very fortunate to have him in his new role, and I am thrilled to have someone so capable serving our fire companies."
