

The Burning Ordinance of Abington Township has recently been updated. The changes allow for recreational fires to be ignited and maintained in fire pits operated in accordance with the code.

When operating a fire pit, ensure that you follow all regulations, including:

- Burning only approved materials
- Burning in a complaint pit/device
- Ensure proper distance from buildings, properties, and combustibles
- Always have an extinguishing method ready
- Never leave a fire unattended
- Be cognizant of the fire danger level

WASTEWATER DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Progress at the Wastewater Treatment Plant is ongoing in connection with the U.S. Department of Energy's Better Building Initiative's Sustainable Wastewater of the Future (SWIFt) Initiative. On April 11, 2022 the Practical Energy Solutions team of the Energy & Sustainability Services group of Spotts, Stevens and McCoy (SSM), the U.S Department of Energy's sub contractor, conducted a virtual meeting with treatment plant personnel to plan and schedule the on site free energy assessment visit to the treatment plant. On April 13, 2022 two electrical energy efficiency staff members of SSM and a treatment plant operations specialist conducted a four hour comprehensive observation and documentation of all power equipment utilized throughout our facility. In approximately two to three months SSM should provide a report of their evaluation and potential energy savings measures.

YARD DEBRIS REMINDERS FROM OUR PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

With spring in full bloom and yard cleanups beginning, we ask for the following:

- 1. Only place organic material such as leaves, grass clippings, and shrub trimmings in the brown bio-degradable bags.
- 2. Tree limbs not greater than 3" in diameter can be cut, bundled and tied at a maximum length of 3 ft. and placed at the curb for pick up.
- 3. NO TRASH or PAPER, these items are considered contaminates and degrade the end product.
- 4. NO ROCKS or DIRT, these items will damage our processing equipment.
