SAFETY MESSAGE & TRAFFIC PLAN

Abington Township works closely with the Patriotic Association to ensure that a safe and memorable day is had by all. To ensure everyone's safety, please adhere to the following guidelines:

Parade:

- The parade begins at 4 PM and will last approximately 2 hours.
- The parade route runs east down Jenkintown Road from Edge Hill Road to Easton Road, then turns right and runs south down Easton Road from Jenkintown Road to Waverly Road.
- Jenkintown Road will be closed to all traffic between Tyson Avenue and Briarwood Road, and Easton Road will be closed to all traffic at Edge Hill Road starting at approximately 3:15 PM until the end of the parade.
- Cars parked on the parade route will be towed starting at 11:00 AM on July 4th.
- Please refrain from using any fireworks along the parade route.
- If you See Something, Say Something! If you notice anything suspicious, please notify one of the Abington Police Officers that will be staged along the parade route.

Fireworks:

- The fireworks are scheduled to begin at dusk (approximately 9:15 PM).
- Parking is available at Copper Beech Elementary School, the Abington Junior High School and the Abington Senior High School.

- Ghost Road will be closed to all traffic starting at 7 PM.
- Arrive early. Highland Avenue will be closed to all traffic between Jenkintown Road and Susquehanna Road starting at 8:30 PM.
- Edge Hill Road will be closed between Easton Road and Susquehanna starting at 7 PM.
- Parking regulations will be strictly enforced in the area of Highland Avenue and Jericho Manor, including ticketing and/or towing.
- Parking at Mt. Vernon Garden Apartments on Easton Road is strictly for residents of Mt. Vernon. All others will be towed.
- Please do not sit in any of the posted restricted areas on the school campus, as this will delay the fireworks display from starting.
- Please do not block any of the roadways on the Copper Beech or Junior/Senior High Campus.
- Please do not bring any fireworks to the school campus.
- In the event of a thunderstorm, please take shelter in your cars.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT FIREWORKS

Q: Which fireworks are Pennsylvania residents now allowed to purchase and use?

• Consumers can now purchase and use "Class C" or "consumer-grade" fireworks that include firecrackers, Roman Candles, bottle rockets, and similar fireworks that contain a maximum of 50 milligrams of explosive material. The expansion includes those fireworks that were previously only available to out-of-state residents. "Display fireworks," which are classified as including salutes that contain more than two grains or 130 milligrams of explosive materials, and professional-grade aerial shells containing more than 60 grams of pyrotechnic compositions, are still only to be used by professionals with a permit from the municipality where the display will take place.

Q: Who can purchase fireworks?

• Anyone 18 years of age or older can purchase them.

Q: What are the restrictions on where they can be used?

- They cannot be ignited or discharged on a public or private property without express permission of the property owner.
- They cannot be discharged from or within a motor vehicle or building.
- They cannot be discharged toward a motor vehicle or building.
- They cannot be discharged within 150 feet of an occupied structure, whether or not a person is actually present.
- They cannot be discharged while the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance, or another drug.

REMINDER FROM OUR ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT



With summer upon us, we all desire green, healthy lawns. We also need to remember that the fertilizers and pesticides we use can run-off into the streams of our community. These chemicals can be harmful to the environment by stimulating excessive algae growth, which limits the oxygen from the water necessary for the fish and plant life. In addition, our local waterways lead to rivers, which are the source of drinking water supply; when rivers are not healthy, public health risks increase. GRANT ASSISTANCE FOR PECO NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS IMPACTED BY COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Small businesses affected by the pandemic can now apply to receive a one-time grant of \$500 towards their existing PECO natural gas account. The grant will be applied directly to your bill and will lower current outstanding balances or provide a credit for future charges.

To be eligible, applicants must have an active PECO gas account on or before March 31, 2020, take service under Rate GC (gas commercial service), have fewer than 25 employees, and have experienced financial hardship resulting from the pandemic.

SPOTLIGHT

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

The mission of Emergency Management is to develop and maintain comprehensive plans to prepare for, respond to and recover from major emergency incidents that might occur in the township. We accomplish this by working with our partners in the Police Department, Fire Department, EMS, Public Works and Township Administration, as well as external partners such as hospitals and schools to ensure that everyone is working in a coordinated effort during major incidents. This involves large event planning, such as the annual July 4th Parade and Fireworks Celebration, as well as coordinating with all response agencies during unplanned incidents such as large storms that create damage across the township. During large incidents, we either work from the Emergency Operations Center or from the Mobile Command Unit to assist the Incident Commander with coordinating communications, logistics and collecting and analyzing data from all responding agencies to ensure that we can resolve the incident as efficiently as possible. In addition to the above, we also coordinate training for internal and external stakeholders in critical incident responses such as response to Active Shooter incidents.
