STORMWATER MANAGEMENT STUDY PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION ON 8/2



Background Information

With growing challenges in stormwater management, the Township identified a need to review current stormwater system management practices, challenges, regulatory pressures, drainage system performance, and flood impacts from hurricanes as well as more routine storm events. In 2019, the Township engaged a consultant, Wood Environment and Infrastructure Solutions, Inc. (Wood), to conduct a stormwater management study. The study's outcome is a comprehensive look at the current and future stormwater management operations and challenges.

Public Information Session - Huntingdon Valley Shopping Center Focus Area

Wood will be conducting a public information session that will cover in detail the Huntingdon Valley Shopping Center Focus Area, providing information on the alternatives considered as well as the preferred options. Information on potential capital project options for mitigation will be available with more specific details on various green infrastructure best practices considered. 
VISION2035, ABINGTON'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

How to Report Abandoned Vehicles

Abandoned vehicles are a nuisance as well as an eyesore. Don't let abandoned vehicles ruin the look of your neighborhood.

Under Pennsylvania's motor vehicle laws, a vehicle is considered abandoned if:

- left on a highway or public property in, inoperable condition for 48 hours or longer
- left illegally on a highway or public property
- left on a highway or public property for 48 hours or longer and does not have a valid license plate, inspection sticker, or VIN number
- left on private property without owner's consent for 24 hours or longer

If you have a complaint regarding an abandoned vehicle, call 911 and a police officer will respond and evaluate the situation. If the vehicle can be verified as abandoned, it will be posted with an orange notification sticker. If the owner has not removed the vehicle after seven days it will be towed away.







The Benefits of Trees by the Abington Township Shade Tree Commission

Trees are a great resource and provide many benefits to people and the communities they live in! Abington's existing trees provide an estimated \$1.8 million in environmental benefits alone to the Township and its residents each year. Consider planting a tree in your yard to gain the following benefits and contribute to Abington's tree canopy:

Economic

- Trees increase property values. Houses with trees have a value that is thousands of dollars higher than properties without trees. In general, the larger the tree, the greater the value.
- Air conditioning costs are lower in a tree-shaded home in the summer; and heating costs are reduced when a home has trees acting as a windbreak in the winter.

Environmental

- Leaves filter the air we breathe by removing dust and other particles; absorbing carbon dioxide and various air pollutants such as ozone, carbon monoxide and sulfur dioxide; and release oxygen.
- Trees cool the environment, working as a simple and effective way to reduce urban heat islands (pavement and buildings in commercial areas cause higher temperatures by absorbing the sun's heat).
- Trees reduce flooding by capturing and holding water during storms, which reduces runoff.
- Wildlife, including our favorite bird and butterfly species, need trees to live because they are keystone species in the food web.

Social

• Trees provide beauty and help people feel serene, peaceful, restful, and tranquil.

• Trees significantly reduce workplace stress and fatigue, increase academic performance of students, and decrease recovery time after medical procedures.

Communal

- The presence of trees makes neighborhoods more appealing and desirable.
- Urban trees often serve architectural and engineering functions by providing privacy, emphasizing views, or obstructing objectionable views.
- Trees may reduce glare/reflection or direct pedestrian traffic.
- Trees may soften, complement, or enhance architecture.
- Trees bring natural elements and wildlife habitats into urban surroundings, all of which increase the quality of life for residents in the community.
