Save Your Trees: Say No to Volcano Mulching



You've seen this common issue: trees poking out of the top of mulch volcanos. But this is actually the fastest way to **kill** a tree. Mulch volcanos weaken and kill trees by:

- Retaining moisture directly against the trunk, which rots the trunk.
- Leading to insect and rodent damage to the trunk under the mulch.
- Causing roots to grow into the mulch, which girdle and strangle the tree.



This **properly mulched tree** receives the benefits of mulch and is set for a long, healthy life.



This tree is the **victim of a mulch volcano**. It is headed for an early death but can be saved by following the steps above.

Follow the 3-3-3 Rule for Proper Mulching:

- 1. Keep mulch 3 inches from the trunk.
- 2. Mulch 3 inches deep.
- 3. Spread mulch in at least a 3-foot diameter around the trunk.

Create a donut-hole around the tree's root flare (where the base of the trunk widens). That keeps the mulch from piling up against the trunk and keeps the tree healthy.

Trees are a valuable asset and need to be properly maintained. Keep your trees healthy by *properly* mulching them.
