

TRAFFIC SAFE-T PROGRAM 9/1 - 9/30




Traffic Safe-T Program September 1-30, 2022

Back to School Driving Safety Tips

Be on the lookout for school zone signals and ALWAYS obey the speed limits.

- When entering a school zone, be sure to slow down and obey all traffic laws.
- Always stop for school buses that are loading or unloading children.
- Watch out for school crossing guards and obey their signals.
- Be aware of and watch out for children near schools, bus stops, sidewalks, in the streets, in school parking lots, etc.

BE PREPARED - A REMINDER FROM OUR FIRE AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT SERVICES

As we approach the one-year anniversary of Hurricane Ida that caused devastation to our neighboring communities of Upper Dublin and Horsham, we would like to remind our residents that September and October are the peak of the Atlantic Hurricane season. While we do not live near the coast, tropical storms and hurricanes can bring high winds (and tornadoes), flooding rains and widespread power outages to our area. If you have not done so already, now is the time to review your safety plans and emergency kits to be sure that you and your family are prepared in the event of a major storm affecting Abington. Before storms, be sure to charge your devices. During and after storms, make sure to avoid driving through flood water and treat all downed wires as live wires. As always, if you experience an emergency, please dial 9-1-1 immediately and our First Responders will be dispatched to assist.

Bringing Nature Play Back at Briar Bush

Richard Louv coined the phrase "Nature Deficit Disorder" in his book, Last Child in the Woods in 2005. He used the term to describe the stark consequences found in his research including higher rates of emotional and physical illnesses that were directly related to the declining number of hours individuals spend outside in our society. However, Louv and his colleagues also proved that nature play improves a child's overall health and development through increased physical activity and duration of play, better focus, and feelings of empowerment. An added perk was the conclusion that individuals who spent more time in nature as children were more likely to become stewards of their environment as adults.



These findings resonate with the very mission of the Friends of Briar Bush. In 2010, the organization responded to the problem by designing and building the BBNC Nature Playscape with hopes of encouraging unstructured nature play within our community. This special space on the

Briar Bush property where children are welcome to dig, splash, pick, build, and wreck was the first of its kind in the Abington area and quickly became a well-used community feature.

Due to its very nature and purpose and despite regular maintenance, the Nature Playscape encountered natural wear and tear over the past 12 years. The water feature was in need of continual maintenance, the natural benches used for both resting and playing were rotting, and the flora that created a living tun-



nel and native habitat was destroyed. The FOBB had created a play space that was well-loved and it showed. It was in desperate need of repairs. (continued on page 2)

Tips for Avoiding Clogged Pipes

Sanitary sewer pipes are sized for water flow. Prevent clogs by placing any foreign object in the trash and not in the toilet or down a drain. These items easily clog the pipes and may cause a backup into your basement or first floor sinks and toilets or even your neighbors. Please respect your neighbors by not flushing these objects into the sewers to prevent blockages in the sewer mains. Most common sources of clogs include:

- Cleaning or baby wipes
 - Although the package says the wipes are flushable, they often cause blockages by clogging your home's main drain pipe which is only 3" or 4" in diameter. Please throw all wipes in the trash.
- Paper towels, rags or cloths
 - Many cloths are made to be durable and often do not breakdown easily resulting in blockages. On the contrary, toilet paper is designed to quickly break down and dissolve into very small shreds so it can easily flow through a pipe. Please throw all paper towels, rags or cloths in the trash.
- Garbage from kitchen disposal
 - Items such as coffee grounds and seeds will **not** degrade in a sewer pipe and will collect and fill the bottom of the pipe, eventually creating a blockage. Please throw away or compost food rather than putting it down the garbage disposal.
- Cooking oils and grease
 - Even though the oils may be hot and some garbage disposal instructions say to run hot water, the oils will quickly cool and form a gel in the sewer pipes. Over time the gel gets thicker and thicker and will eventually create a blockage. Please throw away cooled oils in the trash.

- Plastic items
 - Plastic should not be flushed down the drain as it creates a blockage. Please throw away all plastic.

REMEMBER: Once something is put into a drain and sewer it is very difficult and very expensive to remove it later, especially when your drains are not draining at all and you have an emergency! In an emergency, it is recommended to ask a plumber to power flush the pipes, which thoroughly cleans them, rather than just snaking or cabling the sewer.

SPOTLIGHT

Engineering Services

One of Engineering Services primary responsibilities is to construct and inspect capital improvement projects at various areas throughout the Township; and this year is no different. Our Construction Services team has constructed new storm sewers in Mill Road Circle and Huntingdon Road to reduce or eliminate street flooding. We have also upgraded and stabilized the stream banks near Central and Woodrow Avenues. Engineering Services also responded to the emergency storm sewer collapse on Pheasant Road and quickly restored the pipe and roadway. We are currently working in collaboration with the Office of the Township Manager on the long awaited intersection improvement at Susquehanna and Old York Roads. Phase 1 is expected to begin in fall 2022 and will demolish the brick buildings on the Northwest corner. Phase 2 and 3 are set to begin in the summer of 2023 and seek to establish a wider right turning lane for Old York Road and an open space area where the buildings once were.

As always, Engineering Services staff will continue to provide general engineering services to the other departments of Abington Township, state and federal projects (which includes engineering design), subdivision and land development reviews, construction bids and inspections, management of stormwater & soil erosion control and inspections, attendance at public meetings, construction supervision, and other engineering consulting services, as needed.
