In 2008 Abington participated in funding a consultant to oppose the total phosphorous limits proposed by EPA for the Wissahickon Creek and the tributary Sandy Run Creek.

RECOMMENDED BOARD ACTION

For Discussion Only – A Presentation by the Wissahickon Valley Watershed Association to update the Committee and the Board of Commissioners regarding the revised total phosphorous limit of 0.04 ppm proposed by the EPA for the Wissahickon Creek Watershed area including the Sandy Run Creek in Abington Township.

COMMENTS

At the public meeting held June 10, 2015 at Temple University Ambler Campus, EPA formally presented its proposed new limits for total phosphorous for the Wissahickon Creek Watershed and stated that public comments are required to be postmarked by July 6, 2015. All municipalities were invited to meetings which were held on November 14, 2014 and March 13, 2015 at which representatives of EPA and Tetra Tech (EPA's consultant) explained, in detail, the basis for the 0.04 mg/L limit and what EPA believes is the need for this lower limit to improve the creek's biological integrity. The extremely low limit will require large capital expenditures by all municipalities in the watershed to construct new facilities to remove phosphorous from their stormwater discharges and the effluent from their wastewater treatment plants.

PREVIOUS ACTIONS

In 2008 Abington participated in shared funding for Hall & Associates to oppose the total phosphorous limits proposed by EPA for the Wissahickon Creek and the tributary Sandy Run Creek. Hall & Associates was successful in the withdrawal of EPA's proposed limits.

RECOMMENDED BOARD ACTION

Motion to authorize the participation and equal sharing of consultant's fees associated with hiring Hall & Associates to evaluate and prepare a response to EPA's proposed total phosphorous limit of 0.04 for the Wissahickon Creek Watershed area including the Sandy Run Creek in Abington Township in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00, to be funded from Sewer Operating Retained Earnings.

COMMENTS

At the public meeting held June 10, 2015, at Temple University Ambler Campus, EPA formally presented its proposed new limits for total phosphorous for the Wissahickon Creek Watershed and stated that public comments are required to be postmarked by July 6, 2015. Representatives of EPA and Tetra Tech (EPA's consultant) explained, in detail, the basis for the 0.04 mg/L limit and what EPA believes is the need for this lower limit to improve the creek's biological integrity. We have requested an extension of ninety (90) days to EPA's July 6, 2015 comment deadline, however, current indications are that EPA may only allow an additional fifteen (15) days. Hall & Associates has extensive experience with this TMDL subject and successfully had the previous attempts by EPA withdrawn. Due to the very short time required for a response and the joint, coordinated efforts with the four treatment plant owners in the Wissahickon Watershed, staff is recommending the expenditure to protect Abington's interests.

The Parks Department contacted the Engineering Department to report the collapse of the inlet and metal pipe in front of the pool house at Penbryn Park. The pipe and inlet needs to be replaced immediately since it is blocking the entrance to the pump house of the pool.
