PREVIOUS ACTIONS

Previously the board accepted grants from Buckle Up Pennsylvania that funded the aggressive driving and seat belt usage programs. The six year total amount is \$145,750.00.

RECOMMENDED BOARD ACTION

COMMENTS

These funds will significantly help reduce highway fatalities and injuries by targeting aggressive drivers and seat belt usage. This program is funded nationally by The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and will include the following:

- Increase traffic enforcement through a multi-state, coordinated and focused campaign targeting aggressive drivers.
- Collect baseline data on the rate of aggressive driving violations, including red light running, stop sign violations, excessive speeding and following too close.
- Improve public knowledge and behavior through the implementation of a regional public awareness and education campaign, using paid media.
- Evaluate the success of the implemented countermeasure strategies.
- Implement programs to provide education about seat belts, child safety seats, occupant
 protection devices, police training, compliance monitoring and enforcement of occupant
 protection laws.

With the approval of the Board of Commissioners and the Civil Service Commission, an examination process for the position of Lieutenant will take place during the first quarter of 2017. This motion provides the approval to move ahead with this process and expend the funds from the 2017 Budget.

This promotional process will not only evaluate which Sergeants are most competent to fill the current vacancies, but will also provide sophisticated training and development for all of the Sergeant candidates, many of whom will eventually be in major leadership positions within the Police Department.

Costs for the written and oral examinations will be held to \$35,000.00 or less. Final costs will be determined by the actual number of Sergeants who take the written and oral portions of the test.

The Civil Service Eligibility List will be certified for one year with the option to extend the list for an additional one year period.
